GENERAL CURRICULUM NEWS

Curriculum Proposals & CIM

Thank you to all the faculty and department staff who submitted undergraduate course and program proposals in CIM by the 10-17-2022 extended deadline! The Office of Undergraduate Curricula received over 300 course proposals in October. After checking syllabi for all the required elements, new course proposals and significant course revisions (e.g., Gen Ed revisions) will be reviewed by the College's Course Committee, which meets every month through spring 2023. The goal is to finish reviews by early April 2023.

- For courses in workflow, the CIM form will display the Workflow steps. The current step displays in orange; approved steps appear in green.
- Reviewer comments appear at the bottom of the form.

- Search for the program name, using an asterisk (*) in the search box.
- For programs in workflow, the CIM form will display the Workflow steps. The current step displays in orange; approved steps appear in green.

NEW: SSM Scheduling & Registration Support Webpage

Reminder: Class Features Tool for Spring 2023

Instructors are encouraged to utilize the <u>Class Features tool</u> in ConnectCarolina to provide students with additional information about their spring 2023 courses. Students began registering on Monday, 10-24-2022 but instructors can and should continue to use the tool through the first week of the spring semester. To use the tool, log into <u>ConnectCarolina</u> and select "My Schedule." You will see the "Class Features" link for each course you are scheduled to teach. Copy-over functions and departmental proxies are available to ensure the process is efficient each semester. Spring 2023 First-Year Foundations Registration Policies and Reminders

- Seats in <u>FY Seminar/FY Launch</u> and <u>Triple-I + Data Literacy Lab</u> are reserved exclusively for first-year students (and transfer students who transferred in fewer than 24 post-high school college credits). No other students may register for these courses.
- Students may only take 1 First-Year Seminar or 1 First-Year Launch, 1 Triple-I + 1 Data Literacy Lab, 1 First-Year Writing (ENGL 105 or 1 ENGL 105i), and 1 College Thriving (IDST 101) during their time at UNC.
- All Triple-I and corresponding Data Literacy Lab sections have permanent Catalog numbers that
 match (e.g., IDST 112-001 = Triple-I; IDST 112L-001 = Data Literacy Lab). Since these are
 corequisites, students must enroll in both in the same semester. If they drop one, they must also
 drop the other.
- Students may only add Triple-I + Data Literacy Lab sections to their schedule until the end of the 5th day of classes (end of student self-add window).

IDEAs in Action Curriculum

Campus Life Experience Requirement: Advertise your Department Events

Campus Life Experience (CLE) is supported by Student Affairs and collaborates with IDEAs to help students experience the co-curricular elements of UNC's campus and integrate these experiences with their learning at Carolina. Students must complete 2 CLE events for every fall/spring term of full-time enrollment or 1 CLE event for every fall/spring term of part-time enrollment. Only CLE events submitted and approved in Heel Life will count for a student. Both student organizations and faculty and staff will be able to create events and request that they be reviewed to count as a CLE. Reminder: Catalog Production Schedule begins February 1 – Verify your CAT Users

The 2023-24 <u>Catalog Production</u> schedule begins on **Wednesday**, **02-01-2023**. Please review your department's/school's Catalog (CAT) roles and users listed on the <u>Registrar's website</u>. Search by using your unit's code + 'CAT' (e.g., RELI CAT; CHEM CAT). Every unit has a CAT Editor role and a CAT Approver role. Use the <u>formstack link</u> to add or remove users from a Catalog role.

Policy Updates

Deadline for Clearing a Temporary Grade of AB or IN:

Temporary grades should be cleared by completing the work outstanding, preferable no later than the start of the following semester. The deadline for clearing a temporary grade of AB or IN is the last day of finals for the next regularly scheduled semester or the instructor-provided deadline, whichever is earlier. Previously, the deadline for AB grades and the deadline for IN grades were different. The updated policy is included in the Catalog.

Fall 2022 Student Evaluations of Teaching (SET) Schedule

College SET will open on **Thursday 11-17-2022** for most courses (CHEM and BIOL labs open one week early on 11-10-2021). All Instructors will receive a confirmation email about their courses to be evaluated nine days before the evaluations open (11-8-2021 for most courses). Two days later (seven days before evaluations open, 11-10-2021 for most courses) they will receive an email inviting them to add up to five questions to their evaluations. These questions are reported separately and only to the course instructor to give space for formative feedback. If any instructor does not receive messages from the Blue system, they can email <u>cas_evaluations@unc.edu</u> to troubleshoot why. Additional information about SET can be found <u>on our website</u>. All College SET surveys close on the last scheduled class day, on **Wednesday 11-30-2022 at midnight**. We encourage you to share this reminder with all course instructors, especially your TAs and new faculty who may be new to this process.

Online Learning Contract Manager (OLCM) Tool: Now Open for Spring 2023

The <u>Online Learning Contract Manager</u> (OLCM) tool is now open for spring 2023 learning contracts. The system will remain open to process learning contracts through **Monday 1-23-2023 (spring census date)**. Online Syllabus Manager (OSM) Tool: Open Soon for Spring 2023
